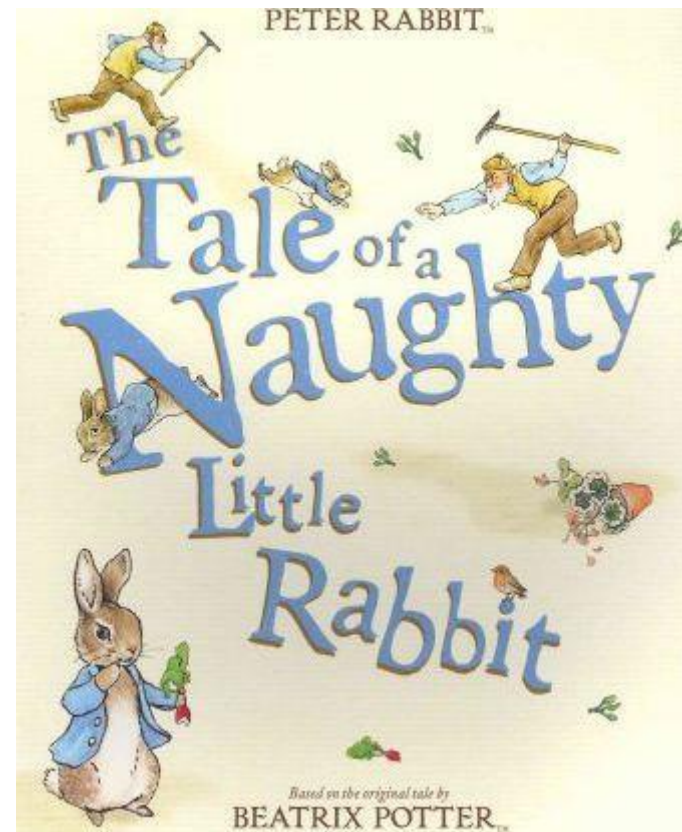
Attached is your child's knowledge organiser which is linked to the text they are currently covering in class.

Types of habitat

Woodland	Lots of trees and usually in rural areas	
Desert	Little or no water and very dry.	
Water	Rivers, streams, lakes, ponds and oceans.
